Dear Miss C.

At its hearing on Wednesday, June 11, 1980 the Local Branch of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

- that in English 250Y you submitted two essays as your own work. You did not indicate that a large proportion of the material was taken from published sources, contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) and G.1, G.6(a)(i)(b) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and ordered that the following sanctions be imposed:

- 1) that you be formally censured by the Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Science;
- 2) that you receive a mark of zero in English 250Y;
- 3) that reference to this academic offence be placed on your academic transcript for a period of one year;
- 4) that a report of this incident be made to the Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Science in order that he may publish a notice of the decision of the Tribunal and the sanctions imposed provided that the name of the student be withheld.
