Mr. R. appealed to be permitted to withdraw retroactively from a summer extension course ITA 100, which he had failed due to failure to write the examination. A full-time student at Scarborough College during the winter session 1972-73, Mr. R. had failed five courses. The missed examination would constitute a sixth failure and according to the academic regulations of Scarborough College, this would mean suspension from the College for three calendar years.

After consideration of the written and oral evidence, the Subcommittee agreed that no grounds had been presented which would justify interfering with the normal application of the academic regulations of Scarborough College.

It was duly moved and seconded,

THAT the appeal of Mr. R. against a decision of the Committee on Standing of Scarborough College be denied.
